



Safe Places is a scheme that helps people with learning disabilities stay safe when they are out and about in Barnet.



You can get help at a safe place if you are lost.



You can get help you have lost something such as your bus pass, purse or wallet.



How do Safe Places work?



We talk to businesses in Barnet like:
Libraries
Sports centres
Shops



We ask them if they would like to
become a Safe Place.



We train the staff to let them know what it is like to be a person with learning disabilities.



We let them know what they should do when someone comes in asking for help.



We ask the staff in safe places to fill out a form so that we know what has happened.



They do not write down people's names.
This is called keeping things anonymous (secret).
This means your information is safe.



How can I get help at a Safe Place?



A Safe Place will have a Safe Place's logo sticker on its window to show it is a safe place.



You can show the person who works there your membership card.
Tell them what has happened.



The person you are talking to will have a chat with you.



They may phone the telephone number you have given them.



They may contact the police if they think there has been a hate crime.



If you have asked them to call someone you trust they will stay with you until they arrive.



The phone numbers of the people or person you trust will be on your Safe Places Card.



The staff at Safe Places will make sure everything is okay before you leave.



If you would like to use a Safe Place in the future you will need to need to fill in a form.
