



DIFFERENT TYPES OF MEMBERSHIP

Inclusion Barnet is a Deaf and Disabled People's Organisation (DDPO) and is Barnet's Centre for Independent Living. Only disabled people, including people with long term conditions and mental health issues, and their family carers can be full members, however if you support our aims, you may still join the organisation as an associate member or if your organisation supports our aims, you may become an organisational member.
